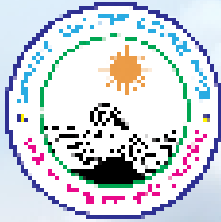

For those who are willing to get admitted in the undergraduate courses run by our college in the academic session 2021 - 2022, let me draw your attention to the fact that the college authority has revised the admission fees structure for this academic session taking into account the impact of the worsening economic recession on certain segments of the rural population during these pandemic days.

I would also like to let you know that Asannagar Madan Mohan Tarkalankar College is one of those institutions in the state that, since the first phase of lockdown, felt the need for shifting to digital platforms from the traditional face-to-face mode of classroom learning in the context of the spread of covid-19. The college has therefore adopted the following measures.

1. Running regular online classes for students following a master routine
2. Uploading study materials on the college website
3. Making use of the interactive elements of online events like webinars in which students can also take part through YouTube
4. Organizing 3 international webinars, 8 national webinars and 4 state level webinars in the 2020-2021 academic session

College Library

The college library has a campus LAN and the library is part of our campus network. The Campus Network/Library Network is connected to Internet. There are four internet-linked computers in the college library. The library is now using integrated library software for its computerization. The library software which is a network version will have online help for user. The teachers and students can get access to the enormous digital resources as the college has subscribed to INFLIBNET.

Total number of books belonging to the departments of Philosophy, History, Education, Bengali, Sanskrit, Physical Education, English and Political Science are respectively – Bengali-1640, English-1177, History-1319, Sanskrit- 1233, Political Science- 123, Education- 193, Physical Education-349, Environmental Science-4, Philosophy-95, Geography-62, Defense Studies-88 and Other Books-222. Thus, at present the total number of books kept in the college library is 6491. The library offers separate sitting arrangements for the teachers and students. The students in their reading zone get the chance of going through the reference materials, national dailies and periodicals particularly dealing with career opportunities in the country.

Students' Health Home

From the year of its inception the college has been a member of the Students Health Home. The students of this College are entitled to get assistance from the District Students Health Home, located at Krishnagar and from the state level centre of the Students Health Home in Kolkata. The students are requested to take advantage of this for free treatment. Our aim is to provide maximum assistance to our students, particularly to the poor and the needy.

Cultural Activities

On the cultural front the college has shown great progress in its initial few years. Every year we organize an annual cultural function. The college took part in the Youth Parliament Competition and Quiz Contest. In the Quiz Competition the students of the college emerged winners. Apart from this there are other programmes like the Social and Fresher's Welcome etc. which are organized by the Students' Union of the college. Stipend and Other Scholarships

1. All efforts are made on the part of this college so that the students can avail the various government and non government scholarships like Jindal Foundation Scholarship, Swami Vivekananda Scholarship, Kanyashree Scholarship, Minority Scholarship and SC, ST, OBC-B Scholarship .
2. For availing the scholarships the students must apply through proper channel within the stipulated date announced in the college notice board.
3. If any person or organization willingly comes forward with proposals of scholarship or financial assistance the college will be glad to accept their proposals.
4. Madan Mohan Tarkalankar Scholarship will be offered on the basis of end semester results, attendance and behaviour of the students. In the case of each Honours subject the students ranked first and second will be offered Rs. 1000/- and Rs. 800/- respectively. In the case of the program course the topper in each subject will receive Rs. 500/-
5. The computer literacy program which has ceased to exist for unavailable reasons, will be introduced again in the post pandemic phase. College will provide Best Result Award for our students, on the basis of their performance in the university exam result.

Academic mobility

Initially the students choose their Core Course (Honours) and Core Programme (General) subjects. The college offers options for a considerable number of general subjects combinations as extended by the University for the benefit of the students. They are also allowed to change their subject combination within one month from the date of their admission to 1st semester classes. The teachers prepare modules in accordance with the course structure, hand it over to the students at the outset and try to follow that throughout the academic session. The intensive use of college library, the access to internet-linked computers, the Computer Literacy Programme, an active NSS unit, a need-based and fruitful mix of the traditional and audio-visual mode of learning and an active Career Counseling Cell in the college contribute to the students' academic mobility and skill development, thereby increasing their potential for employability.

Reservation: as per the government rules reservation facilities will be offered. The reservation percentage will be as follows:

SC-22%, ST-06%, OBC(A)- 10%, OBC(B)-07%, Physically Challenged-03%, Sports Quota- one seat per Honours subject, and in Physical Education.

We will offer 20 seats of GEOGRAPHY and 100 seats of DEFENCE STUDIES for BA General (Programme Course) and Physical Education students. If any Core Course (Honours) student finds interest in Geography, he/she will have to apply for that subject. After fulfilment of necessary criteria we will consider the allotment of the subject.

General Facts

A candidate may get admitted to three year (six semester) B.A Degree course after passing the H.S examination in general or vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by the other Board/Council or Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya or National Open School by the Distance Learning Council.

1. In case of other boards a candidate has to qualify in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English with full marks not less than 100.
2. Candidates from vocational stream or open school will be allowed admission to General and Major Courses only
3. Candidates will be allowed to get admitted within three consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the qualifying examination.
4. Candidates must apply for admission in the prescribed form to be collected from the college.
5. Students have to choose subjects from the list of subjects provided by the college. However, the subjects should preferably be chosen from the H.S subjects.
6. Students have to submit the school leaving certificate in original at the time of admission.
7. The candidates desiring to take admission in this college, if admitted to any other college hereafter, have to submit admission cancellation certificate within the prescribed time.
8. Students have to collect and use college Identity Card within the college premises.
9. Students should abide by the rules and regulations of the college.
10. To cover the complete syllabus properly, the academic calendar is distributed at the beginning of the session among the students.
11. There are occasional provisions for the Tutorial Classes and special coaching.
12. Students have to pay their fees within 15th of the respective month; else they have to pay the fine amount along with the fees. At the time of admission, however, students have to pay the fine amount along with fees. At the time of admission, however, students have to pay for upcoming three months at a time. Students with above 60% attendance will be treated as Collegiate, 60-50% Non-Collegiate and students with below 50% attendance will be treated as Dis-Collegiate.
13. In case of the loss of Identity card, Fees Book, Library Card etc, the duplicate is issued against Rs.30.00.
14. This college is a member of the Students Health Home. So the students of this college have the provision for health check-up etc, at a minimum cost.
15. For the outsider students the mentioning of the Local Guardians in the prescribed format is mandatory.
16. Students can take part in co-curricular activities viz. sports and cultural programme.
17. No student is allowed to take admission in more than one Core Course (Hons) subjects. After taking admission to a discipline one should have to pay the complete fees again to get admission in another subject. The paid fee amount is non-refundable and non-transferable.
18. Until the completion of University Registration, one is not considered to be a student of the college or University. If a student is found with different registrations details, his/her candidature will be cancelled.

Important Facts Regarding Admission

Admission Panel will be framed on the basis of the obtained marks in the H.S or equivalent examination. Where there is no Aggregate Number, the Best of Five subject's marks will be considered. For SC/ST/PH students there will be reservations in keeping with the government rules.

3.1. Class Attendance cum Internal Assessment:

20% of 75 marks = 15 marks of which 5 marks be reserved for class attendance (both Theoretical + Tutorial) in the following manner:

- Attendance 50% & above but below 60% - 2 marks
- Attendance 60% & above but below 75% - 3 marks
- Attendance 75% & above but below 90% - 4 marks
- Attendance 90% & above up to 100% - 5 marks

And 10 marks are reserved for Class Test/Assignment/Seminar(Theoretical-05 and Tutorial-05). Minimum 15 classes are allotted for tutorial portion.

.In Semester-End-Examination of each course, Question Paper be set for 60 marks, distribution may be as under:

- Answer 10 questions out of 15 carrying 02 marks each = $10 \times 02 = 20$
- Answer 04 questions out of 06 carrying 05 marks each = $04 \times 05 = 20$
- Answer 02 questions out of 04 carrying 10 marks each = $02 \times 10 = 20$

However, questions, carrying 05 or 10 marks, need not necessarily to be a single question.

General Facts Relating Admission

A. A general candidate must have 50% (250) marks in his/her best five subjects and must have at least 45 marks in the relevant subjects. SC/ST candidates must have 45% (225) marks in their best five subjects and candidates, they must have 45% (225) and 55 marks in the concerned subjects must have at least 40 marks in the relevant subject.

B. In case of the General whereas SC/ST candidates must have at least 40% (200) marks in the best five subjects and 50 marks in the relevant subjects.

D. The seats in Education and Philosophy are limited and the seat will be filled infollowing the merit panel.

Rules for the Admission in Semesters (as per the University Regulation):

After the completion of each Semester Examination, the students have to get admission within 15 days, else they have to pay fine and will not be allowed to attend class in general procedure. The college will not bear the responsibility regarding their future admission, University Examination and form fill-up.

University Rules for Final Examination Form fill-up

- 1) The form fill up will be done as per scheduled date of the university. The college will not be responsible for any student who fails to fill up the Form within the scheduled date.
- 2) To appear in the University Examination as a regular student, one must have 75% attendance in the class. Students with less than 75% attendances but more than 60% attendances will be treated a Non-collegiate student and only after the payment of Non-collegiate fees the students will be allowed to sit for the exam. Students with less than 60% attendance will be treated as Dis- collegiate and they will not be allowed to sit for the University Examination.
- 3) One must take Clearance Certificate from the library before filling up the form for University Exam.
- 4) Students from the poorer section of the society are assisted by the college in relation to the payment of the monthly fees. However, no such assistance will be given to the students who receive stipend from any Government or Non-Government Organizations.

Disciplinary Issues

- 1) Loitering in the office premises and near the staff room is strictly prohibited.
- 2) The rules and regulations announced time to time by the college authority will have to be abided by the students.

- 3) The students will be considered as part of the college till the publication of the final examination result.
- 4) Absence in any examination in the college will be considered as a violation of discipline and any exception should be explained with proper documentation.

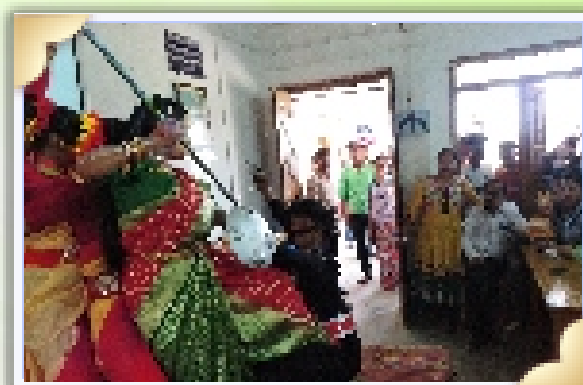

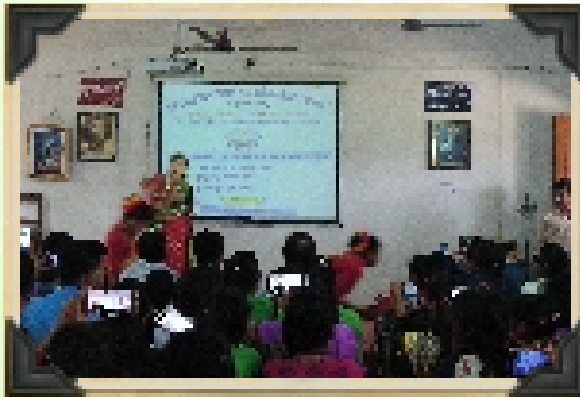
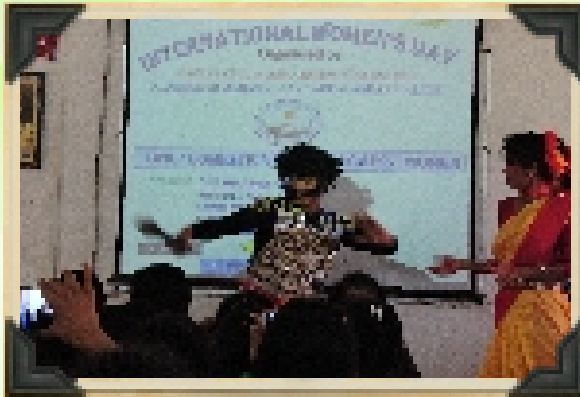
