College library

In addition to departmental libraries managed by the departments, the institution features a central library with over 7,000 books. All library members have access to LAN- and internet-connected computers, which enable them to access online resources. Additionally, there is a remote access link to the college website's catalogues. The OPAC, or library catalogue, keeps users informed about the availability of titles and journal issues through the use of updated library software. The library accommodates digital activity as well, with a cozy reading area set off for teachers and students. An institutional INFLIBNET membership gives everyone access to a vast array of recent research publications, which may be seen from home.

National newspapers, job bulletins, general magazines, and journals on a range of specialized topics provide students with up-to-date information on the job market as well as in-depth analysis of hotbutton problems of both domestic and global significance.

Facilities for Girl Students

The college has a Girls' Common Room with private restrooms and a sanitary vending machine. Additionally, the Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell, Womens' Cell, Internal Complaints Committee, Anti-ragging Squad, and other mechanisms provide a prompt and vigilant grievance redressal system for gender-related issues and complaints. The Womens' Cell organises educational programmes to address the issues that female students encounter both on and off campus, in addition to routinely monitoring the sanitary facilities.

Students' Health Home

Since the college's founding, it has been an institutional member of the Students' Health Home, allowing students to get inexpensive medical care from the state-level Students Health Home facility in Kolkata as well as from the District Students Health Home in Krishnagar. Such medical assistance has previously been very beneficial to our students, especially the underprivileged ones. Besides this, professionals from the Students Health Home offer free health examinations, blood donation camps, thalassemia tests, workshops, and first aid training camps to students who wish to acquire essential vital skills.

Cultural activities

In its early years, the college has made significant strides in terms of cultural activities. Every year, on the occasions of the Social Programme and Freshers' Welcome, in which the students' union also takes part, students present a wide range of performances in the thereof music, dance, quiz, recitation, theatre etc. under the supervision of the Cultural Subcommittee. Every year, the Teachers' Council hosts a cultural competition with prizes offered in the categories of dance, music, art, and recitation. The college competes honourably in the District level Youth Parliament Competition. Cultural performances are held to commemorate national and international holidays such as World Yoga Day, World Youth Day, Wome's Day and Republic Day, as well as commemorative events like RabindraJayanti and Madan Mohan Tarkalankar Day.

National Service scheme (N.S.S)

.Set up in 2011-2012 academic session, the NSS unit of the college has been organizing special camps in adopted villages, conducting events on blood donation, thalassemia detection, blood group detection, arranging awareness programmes on AIDS in collaboration with Red Ribbon Club, conducting cleaning programmes, holding talks on child trafficking and celebrating days of national importance, thereby offering opportunities for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 5th Semester students to take part in various outreach activities

Scholarships

.Aikyashree, Kanyashree, Swami Vivekananda Scholarship and scholarship for OBC, SC, ST are among the government scholarship offered by the college to eligible candidates. Non-governmental scholarships offered to the students include Jindal & Mahindra. This apart, the college authority offers the Madan Mohan Tarkalankar Scholarship on its own to students with remarkable academic excellence as evident in their performance in university examinations.

Sports and games

The college is proud of the rich athletic history of its students and contributes to the moral, ethical and physical growth of students and career advantages of athletics. Football, cricket, and athletics are played on a sizable playground, and volleyball, badminton, and Kho Kho are played on separate courts. From this session an inter college badminton tournament has been started. The college fosters athletic infrastructure, has a consistent supply of sporting goods on hand, and has immediate plans to build a gymnasium. The Department of Physical Education runs Yoga and Gymnastic trainings, and leads the college in athletic and sporting meets both intramural and extramural. Regular participation in University and DPI meets have brought glorious medals, and many students produced by this network find employment in the Sports Quota in various sectors.

Students' Union

The college's organogram includes an Autonomous Students' Union, to which representatives of the student body are chosen yearly in a general election held in accordance with guidelines established by the affiliated university. The Union is a vital component of the college and operates year-round in a number of capacities, including helping students with issues and problems related to their studies and extracurricular activities, taking part in committee decision-making related to sports, culture, sexual harassment, ragging, women, genders etc. Members of the IQAC and the Governing Body include student union representatives.

Academic Mobility

Since 2023, the college has been offering four yearssemesterized programmes (with multiple entry and exit) leading to Major, Minor & Diploma degrees in the NEP (New Education Policy by Higer Education Department, W.B.) curriculum. This offers academic flexibility through pools of Major, Minor, Multidisciplinary, Ability Enhancement, Skill Enhancement, Generic Elective, Discipline Specific Elective, Skill Enhancement, and Ability Enhancement courses so that the students can select from options at their discretion. Upon enrollment, the affiliated institution grants students the freedom to select their options, and at a later stage of the semesterized system, it continues to provide choices.

Seat Capacity for 1st Semester 2023-24 Session

General Facts

After passing the H.S. examination in the general or vocational stream administered by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education, or an equivalent examination administered by another Board/Council, Rabindra MuktaVidyalaya, or National open school administered by the Distance Learning Council, a candidate may be admitted to a three-year (six semester) B.A. programme.

- 1. For other boards, a candidate must have passing grades in five approved courses, with English being one of those subjects that must receive full marks of at least 100.
- 2. Only applicants from open schools or the vocational stream will be admitted to programme courses.
- 3. Applicants may only be admitted for three consecutive academic terms, beginning with the year in which they pass the qualifying test.
- 4. Applicants must submit their admissions applications using the prescribed form found on the college's website or admissions portal.

- 5. The institution provides a list of subjects that students must select from. Preferably, nevertheless, the subjects should come from the prior level of study.
- 6. After verification, students must present their original school leaving certificate.
- 7. Applicants who wish to be admitted to this institution must submit an acceptance cancellation certificate within the allotted time frame if they are admitted to another college afterwards.

It is mandatory for the students to get and utilise their college identity card while on campus.

- Students are expected to follow the college's policies and procedures available on the college website.
- 10. Students must pay their fees by the 15th of the relevant month; if they do not, they will also be required to pay a fine. However, students must pay for the next three months at a time at the time of acceptance. Students with an attendance rate of 60-50% will be classified as non-collegiate, those with an attendance rate of less than 50% will be classified as dis-collegiate.
- 11. A duplicate identity card, fee book, library card, and other cards are provided for a fee of Rs. 30.00 only
- 12. It is required from the foreign students to give the details of their local guardians mandatorily in a prescribed format.
- 13. One is not regarded as a student of the college or in a broader sense, of the affiliating university till the completion of university registration. A student's candidature will be withdrawn if it is discovered that they have several registrations.

Important Facts Regarding Admission

An Admission Panel will be framed on the basis of the marks obtained by the students in the H.S or equivalent examination. Where there are no aggregate marks, the best five subject's marks will be considered. Students must be admitted within 15 days of the conclusion of each semester exam; if they do not, they will be fined and will not be allowed to attend classes in regular session. The college will not be held accountable for their filling out of forms, university examinations, or future admission.

- 4. A refund of admission fees is available if the students apply for cancellation of admission within 30 days. The college will pay full admission fees excluding cancellation service charge.

University Rules for Final Examination Form fill-up

- 1. The process of formfill-up will be completed as per the scheduledate of the university. If a student does not complete the process of form fill-up by the deadline, the college will not be held accountable.
- 2) A student must have 75% attendance in order to appear in the university examination as a normal student, inside the classroom. Students who have more than 60% but less than 75% attendance will be considered as non-collegiate students, and they will not be permitted to take the test till the payment of non-collegiate fees. A student with less than 60% attendance will be considered dis-collegiate and will not be allowed to sit for the university examination.
- 3) The clearance certificate must be obtained from the library prior to completing the procedures for university exam.
- 4) The College provides assistance to students from the lower socioeconomic strata with regard to the monthly fees being paid. However, recipients of stipends from any government or non-government organizations would not get this kind of support.

Disciplinary issues

- 1) The students are strongly discouraged to loiter around the staff room and office buildings.
- 2) The guidelines that are periodically released by the college administration must be adhered to by the students till the final test results are published, the students will be regarded as members of the college.
- 4) Failure to appear for any examination administered by the institution will be viewed as a breach of discipline; any exceptions must be supported by adequate evidence and will remain subject to the approved of the college authority.
